Agenda: A public comment period, where comments are limited to three minutes, is scheduled at 9:10 a.m. Other agenda items will be an update on the DHS Public Health Division budget including potential impact of the May state revenue forecast and recommendations of the co-chairs of the legislative Ways and Means Committee (9:15 a.m.); a briefing on the status of major public health legislation (10:30 a.m.); a briefing on House Bill 2009, which incorporates recommendations of the Oregon Health Fund Board (11:10 a.m.); an update about H1N1 swine influenza (11:30 a.m.); lunch with Mike McArthur, executive director, Association of Oregon Counties (12:15 p.m.); an "emerging issues update" about a New York City initiative to reduce residents' sodium intake (1 p.m.); update on the board's special projects workgroup (1:15 p.m.); and an issues review with board chair Thomas Aschenbrener (1:35 p.m.).
