

## **BCCP Allocations Process 2009/2010**

### *Documentation of Specific Provider Allocation Changes*

1. The minimum number of slots is four per year due to a quarterly allocation system.
2. Allotment numbers were halved for providers who do not generally see the priority population of women age 50 and over.
3. Enrolling providers who are surgeons received the minimum allotment.
4. Providers who have their own BCCP funding and only use the Oregon BCCP for the Symptomatic Program received the minimum allotment.
5. BCCP staff identified providers who may not be able to fulfill their allocation due to capacity. These providers were contacted to determine how many clients they could serve. In the cases where providers wanted fewer enrollment slots, changes were made.
6. All “extra” slots were redistributed to providers in the same county that fulfilled both provider criteria, which means they are both a safety net clinic and in a designated service area.
  - a. One exception to this was one county where all the “extra” slots went to one site because the other site does not have the capacity to serve more.
7. Providers on the waiting list were evaluated according to the following:
  - a. Are they a Safety Net Clinic?
  - b. Is there the capacity to include another provider in that county?
  - c. Does the site offer comprehensive services?
