| <b>Member Updates</b>   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Columbia Memorial – 3<sup>rd</sup> annual radiothon to collect funds for the cancer program. There was a trip raffle that made \$10,000 and \$13,000 in donations</li> <li>Komen- Race for the Cure, Just over 40,000 people and are going to come close to their goal! There are big changes with the grant program, only current grantees can apply for this coming year, due to restricted funding. Taking transportation grants from anyone and mini-grants are available to anyone as well. They are hoping to transition to a program where the grants are bigger and longer to be implemented slowly over time.</li> <li>OHSU is working with Kaiser for a training that was similar to the training in Eugene earlier in the year.</li> <li>The colorectal cancer screening grant was reviewed.</li> <li>OHSU: CBE training in Warm Springs and in Nov. and Dec there will be trainings in Scappoose, OHSU staff and Lincoln City.</li> </ul>  |  |
