<b>Welcome and Introduction</b>	Sue started the meeting and lead introductions	
<b>Updates</b>	<p><i>Committee Updates;</i></p> <p>Treatment: New Norm and Living Well with Chronic Diseases overview and will put out some questions on the listserv to narrow down what they want to focus on and the disconnect with patients going into survivorship.</p> <p>Prevention:</p> <p>BHTF is planning lots of trainings. April 27 is Breast Health Basics. Then there will be training on Using What Works July 13. This is full day training and members of this coalition are invited to participate. In the third and fourth quarters there will be 2 trainings on culturally competency.</p>	

	<p>CRC TF- moving forward with grants March 10 was Super Colon day at Good Samaritan and there were 450 people who went through as well as lots of media coverage. Acumentra has done 2 community presentations on their educational curricula for the community education piece of their grant. The FOBT rates are low so the need for screening grants is high. There was a Governor's proclamation issued regarding colorectal cancer screening month, which is April. The community mobilization gatherings are moving forward. ACS has had one group in NE Portland and then another event on April 21 in Astoria. There will be future ones in Lincoln City and Pendleton CSAW- there is an intern that will be helping with the Progress Report. He will be working with each of the committees to complete their pages.</p> <p>CDC Application- Our grant was accepted as submitted for both the program and the colorectal supplement!! There is a CDC competitive application out for screening similar to the BCCP. Office of Family Health decided to apply for the grant and its due April 10. There may be up to 18 states that will be funded. The Oregon program is going to focus on the FOBT and then allow for sigmoidoscopy or colonoscopy as a follow-up. The kits will be given out to people 50 and over.</p> <p>OPCC Satisfaction Survey – The people who were more involved thought OPCC was more satisfied in every way. The members don't want an application for membership. Communication is the key and we have not equipped the members with an understanding of membership. We need to be able to communicate the benefits of membership in order to make the program work. We could benefit from working with the county health departments and OPCC. Getting new organizations to participate is hard. The reasons why someone wants to participate needs to be articulated better.</p> <p>Legislative Session Update: There are 3 bills that HPCDP prevention is working on: 1. Landlords disclosure of their smoking status and this bill is has gone through the house 2. Ban of tobacco sampling, it is sitting in a house committee. 3. Ban cigarette vending machines. There is also a tobacco tax of \$.60/pack increase and different versions of menu labeling. Legislation and such are the things that can bring people to the table. Possibly put together a budget for the cancer plan and prepare to get money for the cancer plan is a good idea to plan ahead for future dollars.</p> <p>NWPAlHB-Kerri read the grants that were due and that the tribes do not partner with the state more. They are trying to make the tie between the providers and the community. TPEP program and the NWPAlHB should link more closely. The need BCCP contractor met with Kerri, only 12 native women were screened in the BCCP program in the past year and Kerri and Amy are going to work together to get the numbers. They are doing a partnership with Alaska on palliative care. They also did training on grants for people.</p> <p>OHSU- There is adolescence and cancer events coming up. May 21 there may be a presentation on OHSU's grants and the partnerships. They are working with the Asian Family Service Center and they sent out hemmocult cards and half have come back positive. They are also doing a study on women that have many biopsies that turn out to be negative. They are also creating concepts regarding developing relationships between children and doctors. They just finished a partnership with Providence and a breast cancer registry.</p>	<p>Sabrina to look at other states' cancer legislation Sabrina to check on full report vs partial report and if we can get them online</p> <p>TLLD to add OHSU to agenda for updates</p>
<p><b>Chronic Disease Integration</b></p>	<p>Oregon is going to be working on integrating the programs. All of the new grants that are coming out are starting to combine all the chronic diseases. Starting next year there will be the beginnings of an integrated plan. We are going to do an examination of all the programs and look at where some cross linkages are. There will be an ability to get money to all the counties through the Healthy Communities program. We need to look at the opportunities with the partners and the state level and see how they can be combined most effectively. Possibly in June there will be a meeting with a facilitator to help the organizations and the state work with each disease to integrate them. We want cancer as well as the other diseases to have a voice. There will be a template created for the plan.
