	<p>July 13 is the Using What Works training. Cancer Information Services are going to be leading the training. The training is to help to find evidence based program and evaluate them. The top two priorities are breast and colorectal cancer control planners and the training is going to be a dual focused training. This is a free training being held in Portland, we will provide hotel and reimburse transportation (mileage) for anyone traveling more than 70 miles. If anyone else wants to volunteer please contact Alissa Green. The audience is Komen grantees, coalition members and Healthy Communities members. This is not targeted to people who are working one on one with clients. If you have questions please call Sabrina.</p> <p>The remaining quarterly trainings are culturally competent outreach focused. There will be 2 different sessions each focusing on a specific population. The dates are September 9 and Nov 2. They are designed to be more interactive and the participants will have a more interactive style than a presentation style. There will be time for networking. The presentations will use breast health and colorectal cancer as a focus, as well as misconceptions regarding cancer. There will be an educational packet provided for all the participants to take back with them. The presentation should cover what is the most important thing for new people to know who are working in health.</p>	
Provider Guide	The provider guide has been updated, cleaned up and Lisa D will be using Knight Cancer Institute to print and disseminate.	TLLD to email Provider's Guide to everyone for review.
Right to Know Campaign	<p>Mammography training flyers are done. There are 7 techs and 2 front line that have been registered. There is a letter that is going to go to the mammography facilities in Eugene, and it will go out via email to the Oregon Mammography Organization. August 2 is the deadline for registration. First come first serve and there is room for 50 mammography tech and 20 front line staff. There will be a checklist for front line staff developed. They are going to be working on a tip sheet. They have funds to do an additional training possibly in southern Oregon.</p> <p>The Right to Know materials are out and ready!!!! The Right to Know materials will be on the website. They are still looking at having a kick off event in Astoria and a similar one in Newport. November 17 National Mammography day is the tentative day for the Astoria Kick Off event! The event will focus on women in the area. The focus will be in Clatsop County. Mental illnesses are included in the audience. This will be a good way to attract women with disabilities and connect with them. Clatsop is a Healthy Communities county and there is also a OPCC Colorectal Cancer summit that is taking place in Astoria. Possibly use Komen's Women with intellectual disabilities materials with the Right to Know.</p>	
Progress Report	The Progress Report happens every other year and it gives up the opportunity to list our accomplishments and goals.
