## OLCC issues four proposed license cancellations

**PORTLAND, Ore.** – The Oregon Liquor Control Commission proposes to cancel the liquor licenses of:

- LaBodega Wine & Beer**, 1325 NE Fremont, Portland
- Cedars Restaurant & Lounge**, 200 Detroit Avenue, Detroit
- Blue Olive**, 4627 NE Fremont, Portland
- City Center Food Mart**, 710 SW Highway 99W, Dundee

The liquor license for **La Bodega Wine & Beer** is held by Amber Browne and Jonathan Jenkins of Browne & Jenkins, LLC. Two violations contributed to the proposed cancellation. Ms. Browne allowed alcohol service and consumption during a time when the liquor license was suspended. Ms. Browne permitted two minors into an area prohibited by minors. The licensee has until Nov. 14 to request an administrative hearing.

David Layman of Cedars Restaurant & Lounge, Inc. holds the liquor license for **Cedars Restaurant & Lounge**. The proposed cancellation came as the result of alcoholic beverages being sold at an unlicensed location. The licensee has until Nov. 21 to request an administrative hearing.

Farzad Larki and Mohammad Ali Larki of Larki Enterprises, LLC hold the liquor license for **Blue Olive**. A Marion County Circuit Court convicted Farzad Larki of a Class C Felony for Unlawful Distribution of Tobacco Products, which led to the proposed violation. The licensee has until Nov. 26 to request an administrative hearing.

**City Center Food Mart's** liquor license is held by Satnam Singh of Aman, Inc. The proposed license cancellation and the refusal to renew the license is due to Mr. Singh's conviction of a Class C Felony for Engaging in Business as a Tobacco Products Distributor without a License and making false representation or statements on the license renewal application by failing to list the conviction. The licensee has requested an administrative hearing. Hearing dates are scheduled by the Office of Administrative Hearings.

Alcohol service during a period when the licensed premises is suspended from serving alcohol is a violation of OAR 845-006-0498(2). Offering alcoholic beverages for sale in a manner other than what a liquor license permits is a violation of ORS 471.405(1). A felony or misdemeanor conviction committed on the licensed premises is a violation of Oregon Revised Statute 471.315(1)(a)(I). Failure to disclose arrests or convictions of any type on a renewal form is a violation of Oregon Revised Statute 471.425(1).
