OLCC issues six sanctions to liquor licensees

PORTLAND, Ore. - At their monthly meeting Nov. 10, the commissioners of the Oregon Liquor Control Commission ratified the following sanctions to Oregon licensees.

Kayo's Roadhouse East, 594 NE Bellevue, Bend; will receive a letter of reprimand for allowing an employee to sell, mix or serve alcoholic beverages or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensee at the time of violation was Jonathan Ash of Peanuts R Us, LLC. Because Ash no longer holds an interest in the license, a letter of reprimand will become part of his permanent OLCC file.

Center Market #10, 9320 5th St., Bay City; will receive a letter of reprimand for Harjit Singh's felony conviction for Unlawful Distribution of Cigarettes. Licensee at the time of the violation was Harjit Singh. Because Singh no longer holds an interest in the license, a letter of reprimand will become part of his permanent OLCC file.

The Guest's Lounge, 2325 Fairgrounds Road NE, Salem; will pay a civil penalty of \$5,940 or serve a 36-day suspension as agreed in a stipulated settlement agreement. Licensee's employees allowed four minors in an area of the licensed premises that is prohibited to minors. While on the licensed premises, the minors were permitted to buy, drink or be served alcoholic beverages. Licensees are Suheng Ngan and Bori Chet of TGL, Inc.

La Playita Market, 2815 NE Alberta St., Portland; will pay a \$1,485 civil penalty or serve a nine-day suspension as agreed in a stipulated agreement. Licensee, Maria Rivera-Perez of La Playita Market, Inc. failed to verify the age of a minor before allowing him to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when he reasonably appeared to be under 26 years of age.

Coyote Creek Cafe, 497 Highway 20 W., Sisters; as agreed in a stipulated settlement agreement, will pay a civil penalty of \$1,485 or serve a nine-day suspension for permitting an employee to sell, mix or serve alcoholic beverages or supervise those who do, without a valid service permit. Licensees are Richard Feldheim, Eric Metzler and Bert Sinclair of Coyote Creek, Inc.

Good Guys Food Mart, Inc., 84802 N. Highway 11, Milton-Freewater; as agreed in a stipulated settlement agreement, will pay a \$1,155 civil penalty or serve a seven-day suspension for failing to verify the age of a minor before allowing her to buy or be served an alcoholic beverage when she reasonably appeared under 26 years of age. Licensees are Mark Hunter and Dorene Hunter of Good Guys Food Mart, Inc.

The five citizen commissioners are the policy-making body of the OLCC. They meet monthly for one or two days to make decisions on liquor licenses, rules, contested case hearings and appointments of liquor store agents. Commission meetings are held every other month at OLCC's main office, 9079 SE McLoughlin Blvd., Room 103A in Portland. Subsequent months, the meetings are held via phone.
