Where Your Liquor Dollars Go

The Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) contributed more than \$155.8 million to Oregon programs, cities and counties in fiscal year 2008, and expects to distribute a total of \$334.9 million by the end of 2007-09. Of that, more than \$178.7 million will go to the General Fund to help pay for programs such as schools, police and public health programs.

OLCC revenue is distributed to the General Fund and to other Oregon programs based on a plan created by the state Legislature. OLCC, liquor store agents, alcohol manufacturers and distributors all play a role in creating the revenue.

Mental health, alcohol and drug treatment services benefit from nearly \$15.2 million, which helps to pay for addiction programs across the state. The Oregon Wine Board will receive more than \$494,000.

OLCC expects to give \$63.8 million to Oregon cities and \$31.9 million to counties. Local programs that benefit from OLCC revenues include enforcement, alcohol prevention and treatment as well as other public safety initiatives.

Incorporated cities also benefit from OLCC dollars through city revenue sharing, anticipated to total \$44.7 million in 2007-09.
