The **September** program will be “**Immigration and Naturalization- Clues to Locating the Records**” by **Susan LeBlanc**. Susan is a professional genealogist who resides in Coos Bay.

Questions about your ancestors immigration: When did they come? Where did they come from? How did they travel? With whom did they travel? Where were they going? Why did they come? What did they do when they arrived? **Learn where to research online for answers and to find important records.**

Susan began researching her family history over thirty years ago. Her husband David and six children have pa-

tiently supported her in this pursuit. She is a native of Portland. For the past twelve years she has volunteered in the LDS Family History Center in Milwaukie, Oregon. She graduated from Brigham Young University in 2005 with a BGS Degree with a focus in Family History and in 1985 with an AA degree in Spanish. In her work, she has gained extensive experience in using the LDS Family History Library and its databases. She enjoys helping others research, teaching classes and translation work in Spanish. Currently she is the coordinator of the Ruth C. Bishop Volunteer Hall of Honor Awards with the Federation of Genealogical Societies. She is a member of the Association of Professional Genealogists, the Genealogical Council of Oregon, the Genealogical Forum of Oregon and Daughters of the American Revolution.

This program should be of interest to most genealogist who have struggled with immigration records of their ancestors—DON'T MISS THIS ONE!

**Willamette Valley Genealogical Society's
DNA Project**

WVGS has a DNA Project for both men and women.

To join under WVGS:

1. Go to the State Library URL at: <http://oregon.gov/OSL/GRES/genealogy.shtml>
2. Click on Genealogy Research on the left.
3. Click on WVGS DNA Project.
4. Click on the Family Tree DNA icon in the middle of the page.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the next page and complete the form.
6. Click CONTINUE to complete the next screen.
7. Be sure to click only once when you are done so you order just one set.

You will receive a confirmation in your e-mail box that your order was taken. Remember: Only men can order the Y-DNA test, but both men and women can order the mtDNA. It is cheaper to order the Y-DNA 37 marker test as it will tell you that you have a common ancestor within genealogical time for persons you match. Lesser tests (12 markers) provide information on older ancestors prior to 600 years ago. However you may wish to start small and upgrade. For the mtDNA order both the HVR1 and HVR2 panels (mtDNA plus) as this will give you the best information on your ethnic origins. Again, you can start small and upgrade, if needed.

The DNA Project is open to anyone, not just WVGS members. You are not charged until you send in your test kit. You can do the DNA testing through WVGS and submit it to other groups.

She was looking for an opportunity to volunteer when her mother asked her for help on finding a relative, which she is working on.

Susan says one of the things she enjoys about genealogy is that while researching her father's family line, the Watson's, she learned about history, culture and immigration. Putting the clues together and verifying is fun. She is in the process of collecting materials, adding more to both her mother's and father's families and hopes it will be of value to descendants. An ancestor of mother's family, Johan Michael Boor, came to Pennsylvania in 1749 from Germany.

As for OSL, Susan says the staff and volunteers are wonderful, always willing to help. There are fantastic resources here. The Pennsylvania shelves for early German immigrants are helpful, including land records, church records and the complete set of Pennsylvania Archives. And so much more in the stacks.

Susan says it's detective work and makes the world seem smaller and more personal when you find information on an ancestor.

There will be extended Family History Library hours, Beginner Workshops, Ask an Expert and International Workshops, and sessions on researching African American, British Isles, German, Irish, Italian, Scandinavian, and Hispanic heritage. SOHS, CLACKAMAS MUSEUMS TO CLOSE

The Southern Oregon Historical Society and the Clackamas Heritage Partners have announced that they will shut down for varying periods of time beginning in September.

The Board of Trustees of the Southern Oregon Historical Society announced that it will suspend most public operations for a period of six months in order to restructure the organization. This is in response to a financial crisis that has been in the making since the Society lost all of its county funding in 2007.

All museum properties located in Jacksonville will close to the general public on Sept. 7, as will the Research Library in Medford.

The End of the Oregon Trail Interpretive Center will shut down indefinitely after Labor Day. A recent assessment for the City of Oregon City showed that additional operations funds as well as capital investment were needed for the three sites that have been operated by the Clackamas Heritage Partners. Those sites have included the interpretive center, the Museum of the Oregon Territory, and the Stevens-Crawford House.

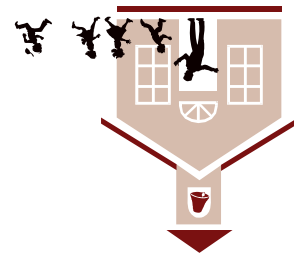
