Workers' Compensation Claims Characteristics Calendar Year 2022

The Workers' Compensation Division received notification of 24,947 accepted disabling claims in 2022. Employment increased by 71,100 workers and claims increased by 562 from 2021, resulting in a 2022 claims rate of 1.3 claims per 100 workers.



In 2022, there were 77 years separating the oldest and youngest workers. The youngest was a 12-year-old farm worker who tripped and fell. The oldest was a 89-year-old cashier who experienced a fall at ground level.

Sprains or strains of the back were the most common injury in 2022, accounting for 3,529 claims (14.2 percent).

The above table does not include 6.2 percent (1,543) of claims where the nature was infection with the COVID-19 virus.

There were 4,305 accepted disabling claims for falls in 2022. Approximately 73 percent resulted in either sprains, strains, or tears (2,141) or fractures (997).

In 2022, 11.1 percent (2,762) claims had an event of "Exposure to other harmful substances", compared to 9.5 percent (2,316) in 2021. In 2022, 2,592 (93.8 percent) of the 2,762 were due to coronavirus exposure.



Bodily condition and/or motion incidents are cases where workers themselves are the primary source of injury or illness, such as a worker twisting his/her back when reaching for something. These events most commonly result in sprains or strains (approximately 73 percent).

The above table does not include 10.4 percent (2,591) of claims where the source was the COVID-19 virus.



Note: In 2022, claims for conditions affecting "Body systems" accounted for 11.3 percent (2,820) of claims, compared to 9.7 percent (2,367) in 2021. Of the 2,820 "Body systems" claims in 2022, 91.7 percent (2,587) were claims for coronavirus infection.

Note: 13.9 percent (3,471) of 2022 claims were for health care workers, compared to 13.3 percent (3,253) in 2021. In 2022, 39.6 percent (1,374) of the claims for health care workers were for coronavirus infections, compared to 29.7 percent (966) in 2021.

INJURY/DISEASE FACTS, OREGON, 2022

- Private industry accounted for 21,318 of the accepted disabling claims (85.5 percent).
- The most commonly injured worker occupation was transportation and material movers, comprising approximately 19.2 percent of all accepted disabling claims in 2022.
- Occupational diseases comprised 13.6 percent of the accepted disabling claims.
- Workers in their first year with an employer filed 8,845 claims, or 35.5 percent of 2022 accepted disabling claims where the worker's tenure is known, compared to 2,225 (8.9 percent) for those in their second year.
- Of the total 24,947 accepted disabling claims, 128 were for workers younger than age 18, and 1,028 were for workers aged 65 or older. The average age of claimants in 2022 was 41.
- Most of the claims were for male workers, accounting for 14,843 (59.5 percent) of the total compared to 10,104 (40.5 percent) for females.
- The median weekly wage at time of injury for all claimants was \$845.08, compared to \$950.00 for all Oregon workers, excluding federal employees.
- Of the total 24,947 claims, 1.6 percent (395) occurred out of state.
