Dual jurisdiction system

Workers' Compensation Division

- Administers and regulates workers' compensation laws and rules
- Resolves disputes related to:
 - Medical services and fees
 - Claim closure/permanent partial disability (PPD)
 - Vocational assistance

Workers' Compensation Board

- Resolves disputes related to:
 - Right to compensation
 - Amount of compensation
 - Health and safety citations (ORS Chapter 654)
- Hearings, settlements, appeals, mediation services



Management-Labor Advisory Committee (MLAC)

Created by the Oregon Legislature in 1990, MLAC provides a forum for business and labor to explore and resolve issues in the workers' compensation system.

MLAC adheres to a common set of values:

- Balance and fairness
- Adequacy of benefits
- Affordability
- Efficiency
- Stability and flexibility
