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SUMMARY

Digest: The Act would change the law to reflect the use of PEOs by businesses to coemploy workers. (Flesch Readability Score: 70.1).

Changes the term "worker leasing company" to "professional employer organization" in statute to reflect the use of PEOs by businesses to coemploy workers.

Takes effect on the 91st day following adjournment sine die.

- 8 <u>SECTION 1.</u> Section 2 of this 2025 Act is added to and made a part of ORS chapter 656.
- 10 <u>SECTION 2.</u> As used in ORS 656.018, 656.403, 656.702, 656.850, 656.855 11 and 737.270 and this section:
 - (1) "Coemploy" means for a PEO to assume employment responsibilities for a worker under an agreement with the PEO's client for whom the worker performs services.
- 15 (2) "Coemployee" means a worker coemployed by a PEO.
- 16 (3) "Direct hire employee" means a worker employed by a client who is not coemployed by a PEO.
 - (4) "Multiple coordinated policy basis" means an arrangement under NOTE: Matter in boldfaced type in an amended section is new; matter [italic and bracketed] is existing law to be omitted. New sections are in boldfaced type.

- which a separate policy for workers' compensation coverage is issued to or on behalf of each client or group of affiliated clients of a PEO, which coordinates the premium obligations and stated policy communications with respect to the policy.
- (5)(a) "Professional employer organization" or "PEO" means a person that assumes employment responsibilities by contract for some or all of a client employer's workers, regardless of the terminology the parties use to describe the relationship.
 - (b) "Professional employer organization" or "PEO" does not mean a person that solely provides workers to a client on a temporary basis.
 - (6) "Temporary basis" means providing workers to a client:

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- 12 (a) For special situations, including but not limited to employee 13 absences, employee leaves, professional skill shortages, seasonal 14 workloads and special assignments and projects with the expectation 15 that the position will be terminated when the special situation ends.
 - (b) As probationary new hires with a reasonable expectation of transitioning to permanent employment with the client, if the client uses a preestablished probationary period in its overall employment selection program.
- 20 (7) "Temporary service provider" means a person that:
- 21 (a) Regardless of the terminology the parties use to describe the 22 relationship, enters into contracts with clients under which:
 - (A) The person provides workers to the client on a temporary basis;
- 24 **(B)** The worker's contract of employment is with the person rather 25 than the person's client; and
- (C) The person retains all employment responsibilities for the worker, except to the extent necessary to allow the person's client to direct and control the services provided by the worker for the client; and

- (d) "Consulting physician" means a doctor or physician who examines a 6 worker or the worker's medical record to advise the attending physician or 7 nurse practitioner authorized to provide compensable medical services under 8 ORS 656.245 regarding treatment of a worker's compensable injury. 9
- (13)(a) "Employer" means any person, including receiver, administrator, 10 executor or trustee, and the state, state agencies, counties, municipal corpo-11 12 rations, school districts and other public corporations or political subdivisions, that contracts to pay a remuneration for the services of any worker. 13
- (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a) of this subsection, for purposes of this 14 chapter, the client of a temporary service provider is not the employer of 15 temporary workers provided by the temporary service provider. 16
- (c) As used in paragraph (b) of this subsection, "temporary service pro-17 vider" has the meaning given that term in [ORS 656.850] section 2 of this 18 2025 Act. 19
- (d) For the purposes of this chapter, "subject employer" means an em-20 ployer that is subject to this chapter as provided in ORS 656.023. 21
- (14) "Insurer" means the State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation or 22 an insurer authorized under ORS chapter 731 to transact workers' compen-23 sation insurance in this state or an assigned claims agent selected by the 24 director under ORS 656.054. 25
- (15) "Consumer and Business Services Fund" means the fund created by 26 ORS 705.145. 27
- (16) "Incapacitated" means an individual is physically or mentally unable 28 to earn a livelihood. 29
- (17) "Medically stationary" means that no further material improvement 30 would reasonably be expected from medical treatment or the passage of time. 31

- 1 (18) "Noncomplying employer" means a subject employer that has failed 2 to comply with ORS 656.017.
- 3 (19) "Objective findings" in support of medical evidence are verifiable 4 indications of injury or disease that may include, but are not limited to, 5 range of motion, atrophy, muscle strength and palpable muscle spasm. "Ob-6 jective findings" does not include physical findings or subjective responses 7 to physical examinations that are not reproducible, measurable or observa-8 ble.
- 9 (20) "Palliative care" means medical service rendered to reduce or mod-10 erate temporarily the intensity of an otherwise stable medical condition, but 11 does not include those medical services rendered to diagnose, heal or per-12 manently alleviate or eliminate a medical condition.
 - (21) "Party" means a claimant for compensation, the employer of the injured worker at the time of injury and the insurer, if any, of the employer.

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- (22) "Payroll" means a record of wages payable to workers for their ser-15 vices and includes commissions, value of exchange labor and the reasonable 16 value of board, rent, housing, lodging or similar advantage received from the 17 employer. However, "payroll" does not include overtime pay, vacation pay, 18 bonus pay, tips, amounts payable under profit-sharing agreements or bonus 19 payments to reward workers for safe working practices. Bonus pay is limited 20 21 to payments that are not anticipated under the contract of employment and that are paid at the sole discretion of the employer. The exclusion from 22 payroll of bonus payments to reward workers for safe working practices is 23 only for the purpose of calculations based on payroll to determine premium 24 for workers' compensation insurance, and does not affect any other calcu-25 lation or determination based on payroll for the purposes of this chapter. 26
- 27 (23) "Person" includes a partnership, joint venture, association, limited 28 liability company and corporation.
- (24)(a) "Preexisting condition" means, for all industrial injury claims, any injury, disease, congenital abnormality, personality disorder or similar condition that contributes to disability or need for treatment, provided that:

- 1 (A) Except for claims in which a preexisting condition is arthritis or an
- 2 arthritic condition, the worker has been diagnosed with the condition, or has
- 3 obtained medical services for the symptoms of the condition regardless of
- 4 diagnosis; and
- 5 (B)(i) In claims for an initial injury or omitted condition, the diagnosis
- 6 or treatment precedes the initial injury;
- 7 (ii) In claims for a new medical condition, the diagnosis or treatment
- 8 precedes the onset of the new medical condition; or
- 9 (iii) In claims for a worsening pursuant to ORS 656.273 or 656.278, the
- 10 diagnosis or treatment precedes the onset of the worsened condition.
- 11 (b) "Preexisting condition" means, for all occupational disease claims, any
- 12 injury, disease, congenital abnormality, personality disorder or similar con-
- 13 dition that contributes to disability or need for treatment and that precedes
- 14 the onset of the claimed occupational disease, or precedes a claim for wors-
- ening in such claims pursuant to ORS 656.273 or 656.278.
- 16 (c) For the purposes of industrial injury claims, a condition does not
- 17 contribute to disability or need for treatment if the condition merely renders
- 18 the worker more susceptible to the injury.
- 19 (25) "Self-insured employer" means an employer or group of employers
- 20 certified under ORS 656.430 as meeting the qualifications set out by ORS
- 21 656.407.
- 22 (26) "State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation" and "corporation"
- 23 mean the State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation created under ORS
- 24 656.752.
- 25 (27) "Wages" means the money rate at which the service rendered is
- 26 recompensed under the contract of hiring in force at the time of the accident,
- 27 including reasonable value of board, rent, housing, lodging or similar ad-
- 28 vantage received from the employer, and includes the amount of tips required
- 29 to be reported by the employer pursuant to section 6053 of the Internal
- 30 Revenue Code of 1954, as amended, and the regulations promulgated pursuant
- 31 thereto, or the amount of actual tips reported, whichever amount is greater.

- 1 The State Accident Insurance Fund Corporation may establish assumed
- 2 minimum and maximum wages, in conformity with recognized insurance
- 3 principles, at which any worker shall be carried upon the payroll of the
- 4 employer for the purpose of determining the premium of the employer.
- 5 (28)(a) "Worker" means any person, other than an independent contractor,
- 6 who engages to furnish services for a remuneration, including a minor
- 7 whether lawfully or unlawfully employed and salaried, elected and appointed
- 8 officials of the state, state agencies, counties, cities, school districts and
- 9 other public corporations, but does not include any person whose services
- 10 are performed as an adult in custody or ward of a state institution or as part
- of the eligibility requirements for a general or public assistance grant.
- 12 (b) For the purpose of determining entitlement to temporary disability
- 13 benefits or permanent total disability benefits under this chapter, "worker"
- does not include a person who has withdrawn from the workforce during the
- 15 period for which such benefits are sought.
- 16 (c) For the purposes of this chapter, "subject worker" means a worker
- 17 who is subject to this chapter as provided in ORS 656.027.
- 18 (29) "Independent contractor" has the meaning given that term in ORS
- 19 670.600.
- SECTION 25. (1) Section 2 of this 2025 Act and the amendments to
