**9/25/24 ADPC Prevention Subcommittee Recap Notes:**

**Welcome and Introductions**

Chair Debby Jones welcomed everyone and started a round of introductions.

**Directors Update**

Annaliese Dolph gave the ADPC director's report:

- ADPC now has GovDelivery which will provide us with the ability to send you a digest of meeting information, news and materials as we go into the strategic planning process. It is an opt-in service - if you would like to opt-in, Stephanie Condon (ADPC Public Relations Specialist) can add you to the list.
- Update on work with Representative Walters: Pam Pearce has been working with Rep Walters for a couple of years to focus on defining what they want to see in Prevention in the state (via a legislative workgroup). They have developed a bill to stabilize and define current state of prevention in Oregon. A few pieces:
  - Defines Primary Prevention
  - Requires a primary Prevention Gaps Analysis
  - A state plan to define roles and strategies for primary prevention practice.
  - Pam and workgroup members are going to ask Rep Walters to align efforts with ADPC Prevention Committee.

## Opioid Settlement Board Update

Lisa Shields provided an update on OHA's status with respect to distributing Opioid Settlement Prevention Treatment and Recovery Funds for Prevention. Slides are attached to the meeting notes.

- \$9.5 million to counties:
  - 15 of the 21 non-LPHA agreements have been executed.
  - LPHA program element agreements have been amended.
- \$450,000 contract with Oregon Coalition of Prevention Professionals and Oregon Council for Behavioral Health (training and certification) will be executed by the end of October.
- \$1.28 million to RHECs - agreements will be signed in next three weeks and then they will work with folks on work plans and deliverables. Work will start January 1st.
- \$2.48 million for CBOs - Lisa walked through RFGA language - Promoting Health Outcomes with Culturally Unique Solutions (PHOCUS.) Slides attached with details.
  - On November 6, OHA will present the selected agreements to the Settlement Board.
  - Populations of focus were selected via data on overdose death rates and lack of prevention and treatment resources.
  - OHA is working on strategies to connect CBO grantees with local partners. Lisa will follow up for technical assistance and subject matter expertise presentation opportunities to support the CBOs. They are prioritizing and encouraging collaboration among CBOs, pooling of resources, and communication of best practice. OHA will bring the RHECs together with the CBOs to also support. OCPP will also connect with CBOs with prevention training and certification.

## ADPC Prevention Nomination of New Voting Members

- Chair Jones and Wes Rivers (ADPC) presented the nominees for 6 of the 7 seats vacant on the prevention committee. These candidates were selected via a vetting process of the Prevention Recruitment Committee (formerly the Prevention Infrastructure Workgroup). The 7<sup>th</sup> (K-12 education) seat needs further discussion by the Recruitment Committee, and they will return at the November meeting with a recommendation. Wes described the candidates for approval:

- Chair Jones asked for a motion to approve these nominations for full membership. Committee Member Lyndi Petty provided a first, Committee Member Pearce provided a second. The Committee passed the motion unanimously.

### Strategic Prevention Framework and initial goals discussion

- Mara Sargent presented the Strategic Prevention Framework (CDC) and gave a brief explanation of how each step/pillar works with respect to implementing prevention strategies.
- Mara took each step and provide questions for how to implement all 6 pillars of the strategic framework. This is an exercise and we will need the committees help to fill it out and tweak.
- Mara walked through some examples with respect to the committee's process goals, including "defining primary prevention in statute" and "aligning the ADPC plan with other state and local strategic plans."
- One of the areas that needs a lot of support is assessment - many of the goals were in the planning phase - so we need to work backwards to ensure we have the data to back up that strategy and need.
- Committee Member Petty suggested we organize it by each SPF pillar and then tuck each strategy under the SPF.
- The group has a year to tinker with this approach. We are hoping to have a dynamic process where the committees work is tying into the larger ADPC's theme of access and back to our community engagement.
- Really need to think of the SPF as a foundation or map to build the strategies.
