Oregon Department of Aviation Provides Guidance on Drones and Aerial Phenomena

SALEM, OR — In response to growing public interest and concerns regarding drones and unidentified aerial phenomena, the Oregon Department of Aviation (ODAV) has released guidance to clarify drone regulations, promote public safety, and address common misconceptions.

Drones play an increasingly significant role in public safety, infrastructure monitoring, and recreational activities across Oregon. With legal operations occurring both day and night under FAA regulations, the public is encouraged to better understand drone activity, avoid unsafe behavior, and use available tools to identify aerial operations.
