Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) Overview


Welcome to the CJC!

- Salem-based state agency under the executive branch
- Seven-member body of appointed commissioners
- o ~30-person agency administering:
 - Research projects,
 - Policy groups, and
 - Grant programs regarding Oregon's criminal legal system and associated systems
- $\,\circ\,$ Agency's statutory purpose:
 - To "improve the effectiveness and efficiency of state and local criminal justice systems by providing a centralized and impartial forum for statewide policy development and planning." ORS 137.656(1)

The Restorative Justice Grant



- Established by HB 2204 (2021)
 - "Restorative justice" means a community-based alternative to the criminal and juvenile legal systems that aims to center the needs of the harmed party and foster accountability within the responsible party without resorting to incarceration or criminal conviction. (OAR 213-040-0030)
- \$4 million appropriated in 2021
- HB 5204 (2024) appropriated an additional \$4 million to the Restorative Justice Grant Program for use in the 2023-2025 biennium
- \$1,312,344 of the 2023 2025 funds are available through this Request for Grant Proposals (RFGP)



Grant Program Requirements

- Must serve the definition of restorative justice established in the program rules
- Must be a "front-end" program design = pre-conviction, preadjudication of the criminal legal or juvenile legal adjudication systems

Green zone is where grant programs may operate



Grant Program Requirements

<u>HB 2204 (2021 Regular Session) requires funded programs</u> demonstrate the following:

- Centering the experiences of those harmed;
- Encouraging those who have caused harm to take responsibility and repair the harm;
- Supporting persons who have been harmed, impacted community members and responsible parties in identifying solutions that promote healing, including promoting dialogue and mutual agreement;
- Coordinating with community-based organizations; and have
- An **ability** to work **collaboratively with system partners**, including but not limited to local law enforcement entities, courts, district attorneys and defense attorneys.

Grant Program Requirements

Eligible applicants

• Public or private entities (may apply separately or jointly)

Program types

- Established → Funds requested to build upon an existing restorative justice program
- Implementation → Funds requested to build a new program

Eligible Applicant Definitions

Eligible applicants include:

O Public entities =

- Any tribe: Tribes means one of the nine federally recognized Indian Tribes in Oregon
- Any public body: <u>state government</u> <u>bodies</u>, <u>local government bodies</u>, and <u>special government bodies</u>

O Private entities =

 Any corporation, trust, association, cooperative or other organization that is not a public entity or a system partner

Public and private entities may apply jointly



Grant Program Preferences

Preference may be given to programs that feature one or more of the following:


- Offering services that engage/serve rural or historically underserved regions or areas in Oregon
- 2) Offering services that engage/provide **culturally appropriate services** to socially disadvantaged individual(s)
- 3) **Partnering with a research entity** to track and report on any program outcome measures
- 4) Addressing cases involving **person felonies or misdemeanors**
- 5) Addressing **case types** that carry a **presumptive prison** sentence
- 6) Prioritizing funding for **direct services to party harmed** and **person** who **committed harm,** or
- 7) Not disqualifying participants based on prior criminal history

Current Grantees

Supplemental funds for capacity building of existing RJ-funded program ONLY

Application available as part of standard quarterly reporting process

Streamlined application questions and submission of budget form

New Applicants

Planning funds for new (not currently funded RJ programs) ONLY

Anticipated product is plan of action to implement new RJ program

Program plan must align with 213-040-0060 grant application review criteria

Funds Availability and Duration

\odot How much money is available?

• \$1,312,344

\odot When will funds be dispersed by the agency?

• CJC will disburse funds starting January 2025

\odot How long do programs awarded funds have to spend funds?

- Project period is six months: January 1 June 30, 2025
 - Project period is the time frame in which grantees must spend awarded funds
 - Design your budget to your project period

\odot How much money should we ask for?

• Amount of funding you can justify within the grant rules and priorities

\odot What about funding after this grant cycle?

• TBD



Funding Categories

• Personnel – salaries, wages and fringe benefits

- Contractual contracted services
- Equipment permanent items over \$5K in value or that are used more than two years
- Supplies expendable materials
- Travel/Training specific to grant purposes
- Rent/Utilities workspace and related utilities

• Administrative Costs – accounting, staff services

 No more than 15% of total of other categories will be awarded without Commission approval



Allowable and Unallowable Uses of Funds

Allowable uses of funds:

- Any program design that meets rules, statutory requirements, and follow all program guidelines
- Programs may serve as alternatives to criminal legal or juvenile adjudication systems

Examples of allowable uses of funds:

- Agency or organization staff salaries and fringe benefits
- Contracts for specialized professional services
- Partnerships with researchers to design to data collection or program outcome measure(s)
- Victim/survivor services
- Trainings and/or technical assistance services related to grant program goals

Unallowable uses:

- List is available on page five of the Grant Administration Guide
- Exceptions are *possible* but must be preapproved upon sufficient showing of justification

Examples of unallowable uses:

- Supplanting existing funding for programs, services
- Employee bonuses
- Marketing or branding*

Application Evaluation Process

- Applications will be reviewed by staff, grant review committee, and Commission members
 - Staff review for completeness and adherence to program rules and guidelines, and will employ scoring rubric
 - Grant advisory committee members review based on rules and guidelines and assess preference areas to recommend applications for Commission review for award authorization
 - Commission reviews grant review committeeapproved applications for final awards, assessing basis for application recommendations, determines which applications are funded





Restorative Justice Grant Program: Planning Grants


The purpose of the Restorative Justice Grant Program is to provide public and private entities with financial support for restorative justice programs.



Early November 2024	Grant Advisory Committee makes award recommendations
November - December 2024	Commission authorizes award decisions
January 2024	Grant contracts will be distributed to award recipients for signature
