Successful Completion Factors</p> <p>What factors are associated with successful completion of the program?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Demographics • Criminal history • Services received | <p>-Need SID and consistent data entry in SCMS for all these elements</p> <p>-Demographics to begin with: Race and ethnicity, and gender</p> <p>Frequency of measure: quarterly</p> |

Substance Use</p> <p>How does participation in tx court impact substance use</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Substance use assessment results at program entry and exit • Dates and results of substance use tests | <p>Other elements to consider:</p> <p>-Discharge while receiving tx</p> <p>-Average number of screenings per participant (to make sure hypothetically high rate of non-successful tests is not because of low screenings)</p> <p>-Average number of non-successful screenings per participant</p> <p>-Average number of days drug free before graduation per participant (date of last successful screening and date of exit)</p> <p>-% that still need tx—do we differentiate between types of tx or is tx behavioral health treatment?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: quarterly</p> |

Treatment</p> <p>To what extent do participants engage in behavioral health tx?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dates of referral to bhv health tx providers • Dates of tx sessions • Tx modality • Tx discharge status | <p>-This is great in concept, but can we operationalize this?</p> <p>-Are these elements captured in SCMS, and if not, what is?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: quarterly</p> |

Employment and Education</p> <p>To what extent do participants increase their employment or educational engagement?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Employment status at program entry and exit • Highest education level completed at program entry and exit | <p>-This is great in concept but can we operationalize this?</p> <p>-Are these elements captured in SCMS, and if not, what is?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: quarterly</p> |

Housing</p> <p>Do participants gain safe and stable housing?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Type of housing at program entry and exit • Length of time at current address • Number of places lived in last year | <p>-What information is captured in SCMS?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: quarterly</p> |
| | <p>7. Risk and Need</p> <p>To what extent to participants experience reductions in risk and need?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Risk level at entry | <p>-What do programs capture upon exit, risk level?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: quarterly</p> |
| | <p>8. Reasons for Non-Success</p> <p>What is the rearrest rate while participants are engaged with the tx court?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dates of rearrest • Charge severity • Charge type | <p>Frequency of measure: twice yearly?</p> |
| | <p>9. Revocation during Engagement</p> <p>What is the revocation rate while participants are engage with tx court?</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dates of revocation • Type of revocation | <p>-Is this an exit type that can be captured in discharge data?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: Twice yearly?</p> |
| <p>Post Program Outcomes</p> | <p>10. Recidivism</p> <p>How does participation in tx court impact criminal justice recidivism?</p> | | <p>-Capturing this by overall, court type, and individual courts</p> <p>-This includes arrest, conviction, and recidivism (<i>any</i>)</p> <p>-What role should this play in next grant cycle?</p> <p>Frequency of measure: yearly (could possibly do every six months, but alternating between the FTC/JDTC work and the MH/ADC/DUII/VTC recidivism work every six months may be more equitable for FTC/JDTC)</p> |
