Old Business


Updated CPC Charter Final -

- Daniel Christensen reviewed the CPC Charter process of how we got to the final version.

New Business

Department of Education (ODE) – School for the Deaf Plan

- Melissa Garner and Boaz Edmunson shared a slide presentation about the plans ODE has for the School of the Deaf. (shared on screen and is in the video).
 - o Where are you starting and what are you building toward with these renovations?
 - Currently we have 100 students, but up to no more than 300 students in the future.
 - Why only 300 maximum?
 - There are approximately 1,300 total deaf and hard of hearing students in the state, and not everyone learns American Sign Language (ASL).
 - o Do you have the staff you need?
 - Currently we do have plenty of staff for instruction and dormitory needs. As the program expands we will build the staff accordingly.
 - Are any of the buildings considered "historic"? Have you spoken with SHPO about that? Have you spoken with
 - There is one building that is considered historical, but it is also condemned.
 - Access to the building will be reworked and an unutilized street entrance will now be used.





- How are things like light pollution, water runoff, and other natural physical spaces being addressed?
 - We are going to continue keep these things in mind and there are wetlands on the campus, and we intend on preserving them.
- o Have impacts regarding utilities been included in this?
 - Yes. The architectural firm was very cognizant of that when developing these plans.

 - This is part one of their process. The next stop is CPAB where they address budgetary items. For our group, this presentation is to see whether or not they have met the administrative rules.
