### Introduction to StateRAMP

Oregon is in the process of adopting the StateRAMP vendor authorization process.

- StateRAMP represents the shared interests of state and local governments, third party assessment organizations, and service providers with laaS, SaaS, and PaaS solutions.
- StateRAMP works to bring together service providers, policy makers, industry experts, and government officials to drive the future of cybersecurity.



#### **StateRAMP**

- ➤ StateRAMP is built on the National Institute of Standards and Technology Special Publication 800-53 version 5 framework, modeled in part after FedRAMP, and based on a "complete once, use many" concept that saves time and reduces costs for both service providers and governments.
- Like FedRAMP, StateRAMP relies on FedRAMP Authorized 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Assessor Organizations (3PAO) to conduct assessments.



## What does StateRAMP in Oregon mean for agencies?

- ➤ Streamlined RFP's/RFQ's and contracting procurement and identifying a safe and secure vendor.
- ➤ Oregon follows NIST 800-53 standards for cybersecurity but lacks pre-procurement audits. StateRAMP would fill this gap with upfront and continuous security checks.
