

Behavior and Guidance: Means the on-going process of helping children develop self-control and assume responsibility for their own behaviors and actions	Change "self-control" to "self-regulation"	Definition wording will be revised to reflect the suggestion. Self- control will be changed to self- regulation.	
Play Yard: "Play yard" means a framed enclosure with mesh or fabric sides. A play yard is intended for sleeping and playing accommodations	Use a common term, such as pac-n-play or define safe sleep equipment and include examples	Brand names of products typically are not placed in rule. CCLD has a guidance document that depicts what is meant by the term "play yard" as a piece of infant sleep equipment	
Serious Injury: Broken bone or dislocated bone	Dislocated bone should refer to joint dislocation	Wording will be revised to state: joint dislocation

Feedback From Previous Meeting

Rule Section: Application	RAC Feedback:	Response:	
For a certified family child care the fee is \$25 plus \$2 for each certified space. For example, the fee for a certified family child care to care for 14 children is \$25 + \$28 = \$53	Fee statement is confusing. What is certified space? Suggest using the language from the application since it is easier to understand.	No change in the wording of the rule since the term "certified space" is used in statute (329A.275) The application uses slightly different language that may better clarify the intent.	
Rule Section: Registration/Certification Process*			
A provider must allow representatives of all agencies involved in licensing process to have immediate access to all areas of the home and premises when child care children are present, including: (a) Records of children enrolled in the certified child care, and all records and reports related to the child care operation regarding compliance with these rules.	This rule slightly conflicts with another rule listed in children's records that allows for records to be stored offsite. Suggest referencing the offsite storage rule.	Reference will be added: (a) Records of children enrolled in the certified family child care, and all records and reports related to the child care operation regarding compliance with these rules, as required in OAR 414-360-0255(2)

Rule Section: 0200 Policies

RAC Feedback:

Response:

(3) As required by state and federal civil rights laws and the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), a provider cannot discriminate against any child on the basis of race, religion, color, national origin, gender, marital status of parent, or because of a need for special care.

- (a) Suspected violations will be reported to the overseeing agency, with whom CCLD may share any information available to it.
- (b) CCLD may deny an initial or renewal application or revoke a certification if a provider is determined to have discriminated in violation of this requirement by any authority with jurisdiction to make the determination.

Are the new rules changing current practice on how this is enforced and if discrimination occurred? This rule provides clarity to current CCLD practice. This does not change the way CCLD currently responds to complaints/allegations of discrimination.
