

History and Year-to-Date

- 2009 legislature passes paint stewardship law
- 2010 pilot program begins
- 2013 program becomes permanent
- Since 2010:
 - 14 years of paint stewardship in Oregon
 - 9.4 million gallons collected



Definition

A wasteshed is defined in Oregon law as being an area of the state that shares a common solid waste disposal system.

For most of Oregon, a wasteshed is an individual county except the Milton-Freewater and Metro wastesheds.



Collection volumes

Highlights

- Roughly half of the amount collected (48%) came from the Metro wasteshed
- Deschutes 10%
- Lane 10%
- Marion 8%
- Gilliam 0%
- Wheeler 0%

Annual Report Findings

- Reuse is slowly increasing (for latex)
 - Helped by reuse events
- Assessing effectiveness of convenience
 - Gilliam, Milton-Freewater, Wheeler
- Program finances stable



Program Updates

ORS 459A.827

- (c) Establish and provide for the development and implementation of goals to reduce the generation of post-consumer architectural paint, including goals for:
 - (A) Reducing the amount of post-consumer architectural paint that is generated in this state;
 - (B) Increasing the recycling rate for latex paint; and
 - (C) Increasing public awareness of the architectural paint stewardship program.



Program Updates

Reduce postconsumer paint by increasing consumer awareness of 10 best practices for buying, using, and storing paint. The goal is to increase reported awareness of those factors by an average of 5% across all 10 practices within 10 years.

Increase the proportion of Oregon paint consumers that are aware that paint can be recycled or reused, aware of the availability of paint drop-off opportunities in the state, and/or aware of PaintCare by an average of 10% across all three measurements within 10 years.

DEQ conditionally approved these goals through Dec. 31, 2025.
