2. Approve November 1, 2023 Meeting Minutes

Les Thomas moved to approve the minutes from the November 1, 2023, Telecommunications Policy Committee meeting. Gary Bell seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

3. Administrative Closure Consent Agenda

Presented by Melissa Lang-Bacho, Professional Standards Compliance Coordinator

The Department presented recommendations to administratively close the following professional standards cases to the Telecommunications Policy Committee.

a) Voyles, Joshua (58251) Telecommunications and Emergency Medical Dispatch

On June 1, 2022, Joshua Voyles resigned from the Port of Portland Emergency Communications Center (PPECC) while under investigation for policy violations related to a dispatch call received on April 22, 2022.

The PPECC was unable to complete its investigation before Mr. Voyles' employment ended due to the timing of Mr. Voyles' pre-scheduled vacation and the notice requirements of the Collective Bargaining Agreement governing dispatch employees...Therefore, the Port determined that it could not complete the investigation before his employment ended."

Based on the information provided, the Department has determined Voyles' separation does not violate the Board's moral fitness standards defined in the Oregon Administrative Rule.

Gary Bell moved to approve the Administrative Closure Consent Agenda recommendations made by the Department. Rebecca Long seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

4. <u>Hogan, Roderick (60731) Certification Review: Telecommunications/Emergency Medical Dispatch</u>

On August 26, 2022, Roderick Hogan resigned from the Washington County Consolidated Communications 911 Agency (WCCCA) while under investigation for two complaints made against him for dispatch calls he was involved with.

Roderick Hogan provided verbal mitigation for committee consideration.

The Telecommunications Policy Committee found the following moral fitness violations and factors:

Moral Fitness Violations:

- Dishonesty: The committee did not identify elements of dishonesty.
- Misuse of Authority: The committee did not identify elements of misuse of authority.
- Misconduct: Hogan harmed a caller by berating her and dismissing the signs of domestic violence which put the caller in jeopardy for her safety.

Hogan's conduct during both calls associated with these complaints harmed the efficient operations of the WCCCA.

Aggravating Factors:

• The committee did not identify any aggravating factors.

Mitigating Factors:

The WCCCA internal investigation was not completed at the time of the DPSST case review and committee presentation.

5. Slye IV, Ernest (61466) Certification Review: Telecommunications/Emergency Medical Dispatch

On December 31, 2022, Ernest Slye IV resigned from the Oregon State University Department of Public Safety (OSU/DPS) during an investigation into his mishandling of a dispatch call. A complaint was filed by the Chief of Police at OSU/DPS outlining serious officer safety concerns related to the conduct and performance of Slye during this call.

Ernest Slye IV provided verbal mitigation for committee consideration.

Moral Fitness Violations:

- Dishonesty: The committee did not identify elements of dishonesty.
- Misuse of Authority: The committee did not identify elements of misuse of authority.

• Misconduct: Slye's conduct on October 21, 2022, during a dispatch call threatened harm to the officers of the OSU/DPS, the students, and staff at OSU, and threatened the efficient operations of the OSU/DPS.

Aggravating Factors:

• The committee did not identify any aggravating factors.

Mitigating Factors:

• The issues in this case are a result of performance issues and not moral fitness.
