

BACKGROUND

Senate Bill 1525 passed in 2024

- Fund transfer of unallocated grant funds from Community Heat Pump Deployment Program to Oregon Rental Home Heat Pump Program
- Transferred for seven federally recognized Indian Tribes
- Funds remain allocated to members of each specific Tribe in ORHHP

Reinstatement of reservations

 ODOE discussions with contractors raised awareness of a need for flexibility if a heat pump is fully installed but final paperwork not submitted within 180-day reservation period or 360-day extended reservation period



TRIBAL ACCESS

- August 2024 temporary rulemaking
 - This rulemaking will make temporary rules permanent
- New rule 330-280-0140
 - Facilitate access to incentives that benefit Tribal members
 - Specify that funds are reserved for heat pumps in rental properties occupied by members of those Tribes
 - Outline ways to verify Tribal membership
- Amended rule 330-280-0070
 - Expand eligibility criteria for low- and moderate-income tenants to include additional methods of verification for Tribal members and units where Tribal members reside






REBATE REINSTATEMENT

Amended rule – 330-280-0080

- Contractor may request reinstatement of rebate, if reservation expired, if:
 - Heat pump was installed and passed inspection within the reservation period
 - Rebate was not claimed within the 180-day reservation period or 360-day extended reservation period
- Applies to all heat pumps installed since July 1, 2023
 - If installed July 1, 2023 February 14, 2025, request must be received prior to May 1, 2025
 - If installed after February 14, 2025, request must be received within 90 days of reservation being denied
