## **Obsidian Solar Center**

## Receipt of Preliminary Request for Amendment 2 of Site Certificate

**Summary:** 

Date Notice Issued: November 27, 2024

Approved Facility: A not-yet constructed 400 megawatt (MW) solar generating facility with up to 50 MWs of battery storage, and related or supporting facilities located on 4,091 acres (6.4 sq.mi).

<u>Amendment Request</u>: Extension of construction commencement and completion deadlines by three years (amendment of applicable deadline conditions).

<u>Approved Facility Location</u>: North Lake County, Oregon

Review Process: Certificate holder requests review under the Type B amendment process, which is being evaluated by Oregon Department of Energy (Department) staff.

<u>Information Only</u>: Please note, this notice is to provide early notification of this amendment request. There is no comment period associated with this phase of review.

Introduction: On November 20, 2024, the Department, staff to the Energy Facility Siting Council (Council or EFSC), received preliminary Request for Amendment 2 (pRFA2) for the Obsidian Solar Center site certificate. In pRFA2, the certificate holder includes a request that the amendment be processed under Type B review per OAR 345-027-0357(8).

The certificate holder is Obsidian Solar Center, LLC, a wholly owned subsidiary of Obsidian Renewables, LLC

**Description of Approved Facility:** Obsidian Solar Center is an approved, but not-yet constructed, solar photovoltaic energy generation facility with a nominal generating capacity of 400 MWs and up to 50 MWs of battery storage.

Approved, not-yet-constructed related or supporting facilities include a 138 kilovolt (kV) electrical

collection system, up to four 1-acre collector substations, one 3-acre 138/500 kV generator step-up substation, 3.2 miles of 138 kV transmission line, up to 2 operations and maintenance building(s), supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) system, approximately 50 miles of internal/perimeter roads, and 7-foot-tall perimeter fencing.

Council approved the site certificate and an amended site certificate on February 25, 2022 and November 17, 2023, respectively. The site certificate requires facility construction to commence by February 25, 2025 with a completion deadline 3 years from the construction start date.

**Description of Amendment Request:** pRFA2 seeks Council approval for the following changes to the site certificate:

 Extension of the construction start and completion deadlines by 3 years, extending the deadline from February 25, 2025 to February 25, 2028; the construction completion deadline is established at 3 years from the commencement date.

No other changes are requested in preliminary Request for Amendment 2 (pRFA2).

#### **EFSC Review Process:**

#### **Overview**

The site certificate amendment process is a consolidated, comprehensive siting process. The certificate holder must demonstrate that the facility, with the proposed changes, meets all applicable EFSC standards established under Oregon Revised Statute (ORS) 469.501 and set forth in Oregon Administrative Rule (OAR) Chapters 345, Division 22, 24 and 27 as

well as all other applicable Oregon statutes, rules and standards.

#### **Preliminary Request for Amendment**

The current phase consists of staff reviewing the amendment request, along with applicable state agencies, local governments and tribal governments to ensure there is information adequate for Council to make findings or impose conditions on all applicable Council standards.

#### **Complete Request for Amendment**

Under OAR 345-027-0363(5), an amendment is complete when the Department finds that the certificate holder has submitted information adequate for the Council to make findings or impose conditions on all applicable Council standards.

#### **Draft Proposed Order (DPO)**

This document is staff's initial recommendation to EFSC, who are the final decision makers, on whether each applicable standard is met. The DPO will include staff's analysis of the amendment request as well as comments received from state agencies, local governments and tribal governments. The DPO will include recommended findings of facts, conclusions or law and may include new and/or amended conditions.

Issuance of the DPO will initiate a public comment period.

Under Type A review, in addition to the written public comment period there will be a public hearing which includes an opportunity for oral comments. At that time, to preserve your right to request a contested case proceeding and any subsequent appeal of EFSC's decision, you must comment during the public comment period on the DPO, either orally at the public hearing or in writing during the comment period.

Under <u>Type B</u> review, there is a public comment period on the Draft Proposed Order, but there is no public hearing. Comments on the Draft Proposed Order must be submitted in writing before the comment deadline. There is no contested case proceeding.

Following the conclusion of the comment period on the DPO, EFSC will review the DPO, and all submitted

comments and provide their comments to the Department.

#### **Proposed Order**

Following the conclusion of the DPO comment period, the Department must issue a Proposed Order, the staff's second recommendation to EFSC. Changes made from the DPO to the Proposed Order are based on the comments of the Council and any other comments made before the close of the public comment period.

#### **Contested Case**

To determine that a request justifies a contested case, the Council must find that the request raises a significant issue of fact or law that may affect the Council's determination that the facility, with proposed changes, meets the applicable laws and Council standards. A contested case is only applicable to a Type A review process. There is no contested case in a Type B review process.

#### Final Order

Following the Contested Case proceeding, or the Proposed Order phase if no requests for a Contested Case are received and granted by EFSC, EFSC will issue a Final Order either approving or rejecting RFA1. If approved, an Amended Site Certificate will be issued.
