






### Introduction Continued

10(4) "Environmental justice community" includes <u>communities of color</u>, communities experiencing <u>lower incomes</u>, communities experiencing <u>health</u> <u>inequities</u>, tribal communities, rural communities, remote communities, coastal communities, communities with <u>limited infrastructure</u> and other communities traditionally <u>underrepresented in public processes</u> and adversely harmed by <u>environmental</u> and <u>health hazards</u>, including <u>seniors</u>, <u>youth</u> and persons with <u>disabilities</u>.

12(3) The mapping tool must:

(a) Be based on factors that are derived from direct input through the inclusive community engagement process described in subsection (2) of this section;
(b) Be sufficiently detailed to allow the assessment of environmental justice <u>benefits</u> and <u>burdens</u>;
