#### Transfer – History Recap

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1988 – HB 2913: Associate of Arts Oregon Transfer (AAOT)
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- 1992 Joint Board of Articulation Commission
- 2007 AAOT revisions
- 2011 Transfer Student Bill of Rights and Responsibilities
- 2015 HB 2525 developed standards related to transferability
- 2017 HB 2998 and Major Transfer Maps
- 2019 Three Major Transfer Maps completed

2021 – SB 233 establishes Transfer Council

2022 – First Common Courses Aligned


2023 – First OARs adopted





### SB 233 and Transfer Council

The right mix of accountability, institutional investment, and faculty commitment





#### Major Transfer Map (MTM) Process: Participation, Collaboration and Accountability

**LETT** Transfer Council **Commission Commission** 

- In consultation with the Council, identifies subject areas for alignment
- In consultation with institutions, the Commission identifies participating CCs and universities
- Creates and charges faculty subcommittees to carry out alignment work
- Oversees MTM development and recommends completed MTMs to Commission for final approval
- The Commission approves or rejects recommendations from the Transfer Council
- IDs lack of timely progress and can force the completion of pathways

- **Public Institutions**
- **Public instititions** required to offer the adopted pathways
- May appeal to Transfer Council for exemption if they can prove a program does not fit a specific pathway
