






The refuge developed a model for working with the community that makes it possible for any person or organization who has an interest in how the refuge operates can participate in the collaborative process and adaptive management decisions

wetlands, and the flood-irrigated wet
meadows across the Harney Basin. In
addition to Malheur Lake, private flood
irrigated wet meadow ranch lands
provide critical habitat for this
important bird migration.

Formed in 2014 with a focus on three phases of wildfire management:


- Prevention

- The need for better access to high quality fresh food became apparent to High Desert Partnership following 2020.
- Harney has very few supermarkets, the next closest being 120 miles away
- Limited trucks bring in fresh produce
- An initiative of the Biz Harney collaborative was created and named: Harney Food Systems
