

ADOPT AN ACRE

2 Acres \$500

Feeds 1,000 families of 4 fresh vegetables for 1 day

1 Acre

Feeds 2,300 families of 4 one serving of pancakes

1/2 Acre \$100

250 days of vegetables for 1 family of 4 (the daily recommended allowance)

1/4 Acre

Feeds 625 families of 4 one serving of corn, peas or green beans

1 Row

Feeds 250 families fresh fruit for 1 day
