Commodity Movement Guidance

PIGS OR PIG SEMEN

Product Description


Pigs, or semen from pigs, that are raised for pork production.

Requirements to be Met Prior to Movement

- ☐ Traceability information is available (national premises identification number [PIN], GPS Coordinates, and information on type and number of animals/quantity of semen to be moved).
- ☐ Biosecurity measures listed in the appropriate Biosecurity Checklist (see sub-bullets) are in place and acceptable to Responsible Regulatory Officials.
 - Self-assessment checklist for enhanced pork production biosecurity: animals raised indoors¹
 - Self-assessment checklist for enhanced pork production biosecurity: animals with outdoor access²
- ☐ Epidemiological information is acceptable.
 - Producers can provide epidemiological information by maintaining accurate records of movement of animals, feed, supplies, equipment, personnel, and visitors. Producers can use the Secure Pork Supply Plan <u>Practice</u> <u>Questionnaire for Foreign Animal Disease Exposure</u>³ to get a feel for the information they may need to provide in an outbreak.
- ☐ Destination premises and State are willing to accept the animals or semen.
- □ No evidence of infection based on disease monitoring (surveillance).
