

# 2023 LEGISLATIVE AGENDA

In the 2023-25 biennium, the OSU Statewide Public Service Programs — OSU Extension, Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station and the Oregon Forest Research Laboratory — will seek state legislative funding for the following.

- **1. Full base funding** to sustain program and service levels:
- 8.67% increase to maintain current operations.
- \$2.2 million to restore deficit from 2021-23 allocation.
- 2. New and expanded programming to support a resilient future for Oregon:

Food systems

Natural resources

Communities, with focus on:

- Rural economic development and healthy communities.
- Urban social and environmental systems.
- Community health including behavioral health and houselessness.

And bolster capacity to enhance core mission work in critical areas across ag, forestry, public health and youth development.

State funding is a critical complement to local investment in OSU Extension, and provides for delivery of statewide programming that is responsive to local needs.



### **ACTIVITIES AND SERVICES FOR EVERY COMMUNITY**

With financial and facilities support from local government partners and input from local advisory councils, OSU Extension professionals work to understand and respond to community priorities. As a result, Extension is different in each county and community.

Here are a few highlights of our work across Oregon.



### Thriving youth, individuals and families

**Cultivating positive youth development** by engaging youth in hands-on, experiential learning that fosters essential skills for life and leadership. Empowering students and families to access education and advance their careers. Includes 4-H, Juntos, Outdoor School and more.



### Sustainable agriculture, food systems and gardening

**Encouraging resilience across the food chain** by enhancing pollinator health, farm and ranch productivity, food safety and food access in a changing climate. Supporting home and community gardens, and farms of all sizes. Includes Master Gardener, Master Melittologist, Small Farms Program and more.



### Resilient and productive forests and natural ecosystems

**Supporting sustainable natural resource management** to ensure our forests and ecosystems continue to provide a wide array of benefits. Supporting woodland owners, communities and industry though research, education, technical support and community scientists. Includes Oregon Sea Grant, OSU Extension Fire Program, Master Woodland Manager, Oregon Forest Pest Detector and more.



### Healthy communities and economies

Enhancing health and well-being for every stage of life through culturally-relevant, evidence-based programs on mental health, nutrition and physical activity, food preservation and more. Working with community coalitions toward positive change at individual, community and system levels. Supporting workforce development by building job skills and increasing college access.
