Current Water Supplies/ Sources

1. Irrigation Water Supply

The existing, perfected water groundwater right, certificate #76538 provides 100% of the irrigation water necessary to operate the proposed CAFO. The CAFO will not land apply any litter or compost to any irrigated land on the CAFO so this irrigation water will not be needed.

2. Agricultural Water Supply/ Sources

The existing, water right exemption of up to 5,000 gallons per day will meet the agricultural water use needs necessary to operate the proposed CAFO. This water will come from an existing well currently on site and a new well that will be installed as a secondary/backup well.

3. Stock Watering Supply/ Sources

The existing water right exemption for watering livestock from groundwater sources will meet the stock watering needs necessary to operate the proposed CAFO at full capacity. This water will come from an existing well currently on site and a new well that will be installed as a secondary/backup well.

Katie and Isaac, attached is the signed copy from OWRD. It is not identified in the plan, but OWRD will also require that the commercial/agricultural water used under the exemption in ORS 537.545(1)(f) has a dedicated totalizing flow meter that is isolated from water diverted for other uses at the facility. Under this exemption up to 5,000 gallons can be used for commercial purposes. I also recommend a condition that allows ODA/OWRD to inspect the meter upon installation and access the meter to take readings periodically.

Please let me know if you need anything additional from me on this. I would be happy to talk to you or Eric about the type of meter that would work best for this situation.
