Background of the SIA Performance Review

SIA Performance Review Template - SIA Performance Review Questions

As articulated in the Student Success Act, the two stated purposes for the funds distributed under the Student Investment Account are to:

- 1. Meet students' mental or behavioral health needs; and
- 2. Increase academic achievement for students, including reducing academic disparities for students: of color, with disabilities, who are emerging bilinguals'; or those navigating poverty, experiencing homelessness, or in foster care and any others historically experiencing academic disparities as determined by the State Board¹.

<u>Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 327.201</u> states "Each [SIA] grant recipient must conduct a performance review every four years, as required by standards adopted by the board by rule"². To comply with this provision, the State Board of Education adopted <u>OAR 581–014-0013</u> for conducting the performance review.

The language and criteria from OAR 581–014-0013 are addressed in further detail later in this document.

2020-2023 SIA Performance Review - Purpose and Process

The 2020-2023 SIA Performance Review will be the first review grantees have undergone, reflecting on the first three years of SIA implementation. The goal of this process is to reflect on the progress grantees have made as well as the challenges grantees have encountered related to SIA's intended purposes. The SIA Performance Review will help us collectively know and tell the story of the first three years of SIA implementation across Oregon.

The process to complete this review will involve these steps:

- ODE will utilize previously reviewed responses that grantees provided in SIA Annual Reports from 2020-23 to populate a customized version of the <u>SIA Performance Review</u> <u>Template</u> which includes:
 - Annual Report responses,
 - o SIA Plan Strategies/Outcomes, and

- the three additional questions grantees will answer for this SIA
 Performance Review.
- Grantees will respond to the three SIA Performance Review questions either in a call/conversation with their Regional Support point person and District Grant Manager or in written response via email.
- Regional Support staff in EII will send grantees a confirmation email indicating the completion of their SIA Performance Review with the grantee's responses in an attached PDF.

Anticipated Timeline

August 1, 2024

• Grantees receive their individualized Performance Review Template with an invitation to schedule an optional 45-minute call with their Regional Support Team.

August 15, 2024 - October 31, 2024

• All grantees complete the Performance Review either through a call/conversation or by emailing their written responses.

November 30, 2024

Grantees receive a confirmation email signifying completion of their Performance Review.
