2024-25 DTC Roadmap Published, New DTC Orientation **Coming Soon**

The 2024-25 District Test Coordinator (DTC) Roadmap has been published on ODE's Assessment Administration webpage. This resource was created to support DTCs new to their role yet may prove helpful for veteran DTCs as well. The DTC Roadmap is organized into three sections – Before, During, and After Testing. Each section lists important events and key DTC responsibilities. The DTC Roadmap supplements, but does not replace, official ODE publications.

ODE is organizing an optional New DTC Orientation series this fall, in partnership with DTCs and ESD Partners. This series, which follows the same sequence as the DTC Roadmap, will provide detailed information from the perspectives of DTCs and ESD Partners. The New DTC Orientation will begin with three 60-minute sessions in the fall, followed by shorter "just in time" sessions as the academic year progresses. More information is coming soon! TEST ADMINISTRATION

New - Test Administration Monitoring

Per United States Department of Education requirements, ODE is implementing a desk monitoring process for district test administration beginning in the 2024-25 school year. Monitoring will follow a five-year rotation, during which each district and ESD will complete an online test administration self-assessment according to the schedule below. Districts complete this selfassessment once per rotation, although they are encouraged to incorporate it into their ongoing continuous improvement efforts. A preview of the self-assessment is available on ODE's Assessment Administration page.

The self-assessment form will be made available online to districts by April 2025 and must be submitted electronically by the end of their testing season or by June 30, 2025. Throughout the 2024-25 school year, ODE's Assessment Team will provide resources and hold office hours to support this monitoring effort.

Districts participate in required ESSA Test Administration Monitoring by region:

- 2024-25: Lane ESD, Linn-Benton-Lincoln ESD, Willamette ESD
- 2025-26: Harney ESD, High Desert ESD, Jefferson ESD, Lake County ESD, Malheur ESD
- 2026-27: Grant County ESD, Intermountain ESD, North Central ESD, Region 18 ESD
- 2027-28: Clackamas ESD, Columbia Gorge ESD, Multnomah ESD, NW Regional ESD
- 2028-29: Douglas ESD, South Coast ESD, Southern Oregon ESD

Teacher Qualification Closes on September 13, 2024

The Teacher Qualification validation closes on **September 13, 2024**. If you have not already done so, please log into the Achievement Data Insight (ADI) application and select the Teacher Qualification validation to review your data.

As you review your data, you may see teachers that have incorrect Emergency/Provisional, Out of Field, or Preliminary License flags. The last day to make changes to your Class Roster Collection will be Friday, September 20. The collection cannot be reopened after this date. data. Class Size data will be published in a <u>standalone report</u> in late November.
