ELTC Fall 2025 Pilot: Onboarding Meeting

The Oregon Department of Education (ODE) and the Department of Early Learning and Care (DELC) is seeking schools/districts to join Fall 2025 pilot of the Early Learning Transition Check-In: A Collaborative Engagement with Community (ELTC), the process to redesign Oregon's Kindergarten Assessment aligned to OAR 581-022-2130.

While requirements of the Family Conversation, the first component of the ELTC, will not be confirmed until after the 2025 legislative session, we invite interested charter schools and districts to partner to begin the planning process with other schools and districts. This community of practice approach will support schools and districts in addressing challenges, refining practices, and engaging in intentional planning that will lead to successful implementation of the Fall 2025 Family Conversation.
