Potential IDEA Non-Compliance Improprieties

Context

Updated Guidance from US Department of Education Office of Special Education and Rehabilitative Services published July 24, 2023

Data from 2023-24 test window:

- 334 total potential IDEA non-compliance test improprieties
- 239 were resolved (72%)
- 95 were not resolved (28%)

Expected outcomes for 2024-25 changes:

 Increased resolution rate for potential IDEA non-compliance test improprieties

Process

Overall process remains unchanged:

- 1) District submits the impropriety
- 2) ODE staff processes the impropriety
- 3) District receives ODE response confirming action taken with test record

For issues with a "Yes" under possible IDEA non-compliance, two new elements:

- 1) The system sends a separate automated update request to district
- 2) After district completes required action, they inform ODE via a link in the automated update request email

District Action

- 1) Resolve the issue. This *usually* involves:
 - a) Retesting the student with the correct test and correct accessibility supports in place, OR
 - b) Confirming that an appropriate retest is not possible.
- 2) Submit an IDEA compliance update as requested in automated email.
 - a) District will see an "Update Complete" confirmation page.
 - b) District can request a copy of their responses.
 - c) Resolved issues will no longer send requests.

Expected Impact

In 2023-24, 61 districts reported potential IDEA non-compliance test improprieties:

- Average = 5
- Median = 2
- Most common = 1 (22 districts)
- 8 districts had 10 or more

IDEA Program staff have access to ODE's test impropriety data.

Chromebook Secure Browser Update

ChromeOS version 133 changed a required setting for the secure browser.

To ensure Chromebooks can be used for testing in 2025, do at least one of the following by December (**both** is recommended):

- 1. Ensure all devices are on the Long-Term Support (LTS) channel or the Long-Term Support Candidate (LTC) channel (see Long-term Support (LTS) on ChromeOS).
- Enable the <u>NativeClientForceAllowed (NaCl)</u> setting in the ChromeOS
 Management Console (see <u>Chrome Enterprise Policy List & Management | Documentation</u>).

PreACT Update

What's new?

- Oregon Department of Justice (DOJ) review ongoing with the updated information that was required.
- We received confirmation from IntermediaryEd on Tuesday, September 24 that the Oregon Secretary of State (SOS) had completed that part of the process and shared with DOJ.
- Review may take 30 days from September 24 to complete (by ~October 29)

1% ORExt Participation Reporting

- ✓ Projections were due October 1st
- ✓ Next steps notifications from ESD Partners
- □ Justification information and district plan, due **November 15**
 - For those projected to exceed 1% in any content area
- ☐ Disproportionality plan, due **November 15**
 - For those with disproportionality in their past participation
