# Student Sample A Grade 5 Opinion Writing Performance Task: Zoos

## **SCORES AND COMMENTARY**

## Ideas and Content: 4

Writer's purpose and main ideas are easy to understand. An opinion is clearly stated I strongly agree with having zoos., and reasons research, education, and to keep animals from extinction are given. These are just a few reasons why we need zoos.

# Organization: 4

Information is grouped to make sense. The introduction is developed and identifies the topic. Do you think that we should have zoos? I strongly agree with having zoos.... The concluding section is about the opinion or information presented. The writer restates their opinion and reiterates the reasons of support that were provided in the essay. Transition words (e.g., One reason, Zoos also, Another reason, That is how) connect ideas and make the writing easy to follow. Paragraph breaks help the reader.

#### Voice: 4

Parts are sincere or honest. I strongly believe that we should have zoos.... This is how zoos help us with research. The writing helps the reader to engage and pay attention to the information and ideas. This means that it is a safe place to learn as well as fun! That is how zoos teach kids. The writer seems interested in the topic. That is how breeding programs are good.

## Word Choice: 4

Words get the message across. Words (e.g., offer, learned, next generation, according, important) have variety. The writing includes many content vocabulary words (e.g., research, education, extinction, biologist, breeding, species) about the topic.

# Sentence Fluency: 4

Sentences begin in different ways (e.g., *Do you think, Zoos offer, Zoos also help with, I also learned, This means*). Some sentences are shorter and some sentences are longer (refer to the first and last paragraphs).

## **Conventions: 4**

Sentences end where they should with the correct punctuation mark. Common words (e.g., think, education, animal, adults, believe, opinion) are spelled correctly. Even difficult words (e.g., reproduction, horned oryx, biologists, species, endangered, extinction) are spelled correctly (score of 5). Capital letters are usually correct. Errors require some editing. The preponderance of evidence supports the score of 4.

## **Use of Sources: 4**

The writer uses information about the topic from sources. Sources 1 and 3 are accurately identified. The writer was not required to provide a list of sources on this task.
