# Topic: Offer versus Serve

#### Overview/What is?

Offer Versus Serve (OVS) is a provision in the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program that allows students to decline some of the food offered. The goals of OVS are to reduce food waste in the school meals programs while permitting students to decline foods they do not intend to eat.

## **OVS General Requirements:**

- ✓ Required at lunch for grades 9-12.
- ✓ Optional at lunch for grades K-8.
- ✓ Optional for grades K-12 for breakfast.
- Optional for lunches served under the Seamless Summer Option (SSO).
- ✓ Offer versus serve is not allowable for the Afterschool Snack Service.
- ✓ Offer versus serve is not allowable for non-comingled preschool students.
- ✓ Signage explaining what constitutes a reimbursable meal, including the requirement to select at least ½ cup fruit or vegetables, must be posted at or close to the beginning of the service line.
- ✓ Staff responsible for identifying a reimbursable meal at the point of service must be trained and be able to identify what constitutes a reimbursable meal.

#### **Exceptions:**

- An OVS exception may be granted when there are logistical limitations, such as facility or space restrictions, or situations where students are unable to select from food offered.
- OVS signage is not required for field trips or breakfast in the classroom, however, other methods should be used to inform students of their choices.
