West Bend Pilot

- Participating agencies are members of the Pacific Northwest Joint
 Group on Prescribed Fire and Smoke Management and are unified in
 their support to increase the pace and scale of prescribed fire while
 making every effort to ensure that vulnerable populations and
 communities disproportionately burdened by smoke are protected by
 pursuing increased public health interventions to meet the community
 needs.
- Pilot included increased air quality monitoring, increased public communication, and increased smoke forecasting for burns.
























Burn Units

Burns Accomplished in:


- Welcome Station (WS)

Just over 1,400 acres accomplished during pilot compared to a typical season of around 300 acres.






Smoke Forecasts

PB-Piedmont model prediction – May 15, 2024






