Discussion/interpretation:

This policy transmittal is intended to give clarification for Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) Aging and People with Disabilities (APD) long-term care facilities providing care to individuals who may choose to consume medical or recreational cannabis products. Although products containing cannabis are legal in Oregon, they are illegal at the federal level. ODHS APD services are funded with federal dollars which cannot be used in the acquisition or administration of any federally illegal product including cannabis.

Because products containing cannabis are legal in Oregon, APD providers may allow the products to be stored and used on site following the same protocols for other controlled substances including safe storage standards. APD providers who do allow for the use and storage of cannabis products must maintain policies outlining how residents may use and store cannabis and clarifying that no assistance can be provided in the acquisition or administration of the cannabis product. Acquisition may not include any Activities of Daily Living (ADL) or Instrumental Activities of Daily Living (IADL) supports to plan for, budget for, travel to or shop for any product containing cannabis. Application may not include any ADL or IADL supports to prepare, dose, apply or deliver any product containing cannabis.

<u>Implementation/transition instructions</u>: Review and discussion with local licensing staff and providers.

<u>Training/communication plan</u>: Managers will ensure the information contained in this policy is conveyed to all providers in these settings.

<u>Local/branch action required</u>: Review and follow-up with SOQ Policy as questions arise.
