

Do you need to change your name or gender marker on your ID card, license, registration or title?

To change your name or gender marker (appears as "sex" on the license) on your Oregon ID, instruction permit or driver's license, you will need to visit an Oregon DMV office to get a new card. Walk-ins are welcome at all DMV offices; you can also make an appointment at <u>DMV2U.Oregon.gov</u>.

Gender marker

If you are changing only your gender marker, just bring your current ID, instruction permit or driver's license with you to your local DMV to start your application. Simply select one of the three gender markers — M (male), F (female) or X (not specified) — and pay for a new or replacement ID, permit or driver's license. Additional fees (and document needs) apply to REAL ID credentials.

Name change

If you are changing your name on your driver's license, ID card, permit, registration or title, you will need to bring in official documentation proving your new identity when you visit a DMV office. View the list of acceptable documents at <u>oregon.gov/odot/dmv/pages/driverid/idproof.aspx</u>.
