Top 10 Truck driver At Fault Errors:

1. Speed
2. Fail to Remain in Lane
3. Following to Close
4. Inattention
5. Fail to Yield Right of Way
6. Improper Lane Change
7. Sleep/Fatigue
8. Disregard Sign
9. Tire Failure

Top Ten Car Driver at Fault (versus CMV) Errors:

1. Fail to Yield Right of Way
2. Following to Close
3. Fail to Remain in Lane
4. Speed
5. Disregard Sign/Signal
6. Improper Passing
7. Inattention
8. Drinking Alcohol
9. Sleep/Fatigue
10. Improper Turn
