



Key Elements of the 2024-2028 SAP

- Connects long-term OTC-adopted policies to short-term actions, is an implementation element of the OTP
- Decisions are made through the safety, climate and equity lens
- Brings in more core and foundational elements, in addition to new work
- Communicates agency priorities in the context of financial realities, and articulates gaps and needs consistent with funding conversations
- Creates increased accountability to key outcomes

 - Tolling as part of the Urban Mobility Strategy (p 20)

- Specific references
 - Begin collecting tolling revenue by 2026 (pages 7 and 23)
 - Advance toll system design and operations for IBR, I205, and RMPP (pages 21 and 26)

 - Reporting starts May 2024
- Development of updated SAP Dashboard

Example Milestones:Provide Excellent Customer Service

Action: Launch self-service kiosks to allow the public to administer DMV transactions. (2024)

March 2024

- Identify pilot locations and coordinate with private sector kiosk hosts
- Identify initial transactions to make available to the public

July 2024

Build the kiosk interfaces and complete testing

August 2024

Launch three pilot locations and identify additional locations



Example Milestones: Improve Equitable Outcomes

Action: Apply an equity lens to ODOT investment decisions, increasing equitable outcomes (2026)



Establish an evaluation process for understanding equity outcomes in STIP investment decisions



January 2025

Complete project scoping and identification of projects
