





County and City Revenue Comparison

Oregon County Road Funds Revenue History






Oregon County Road Expenditures by Type


Oregon City Road Expenditures by Type FY 2023




Oregon County Road Funds Expenditure History









2019 Pavement Condition




2023 Pavement Condition



Oregon County Structurally Deficient Bridge Replacement Needs for the next Five Years











Protect and expand current revenue sources—gas tax, motor carrier, DMV fees—to support maintenance, operations, preservation, and system improvements of the shared transportation system


- Priority: Maintain the 50/30/20 formula







Counties received just 8 percent of discretionary funding under the selection of programs in FY 2022.




