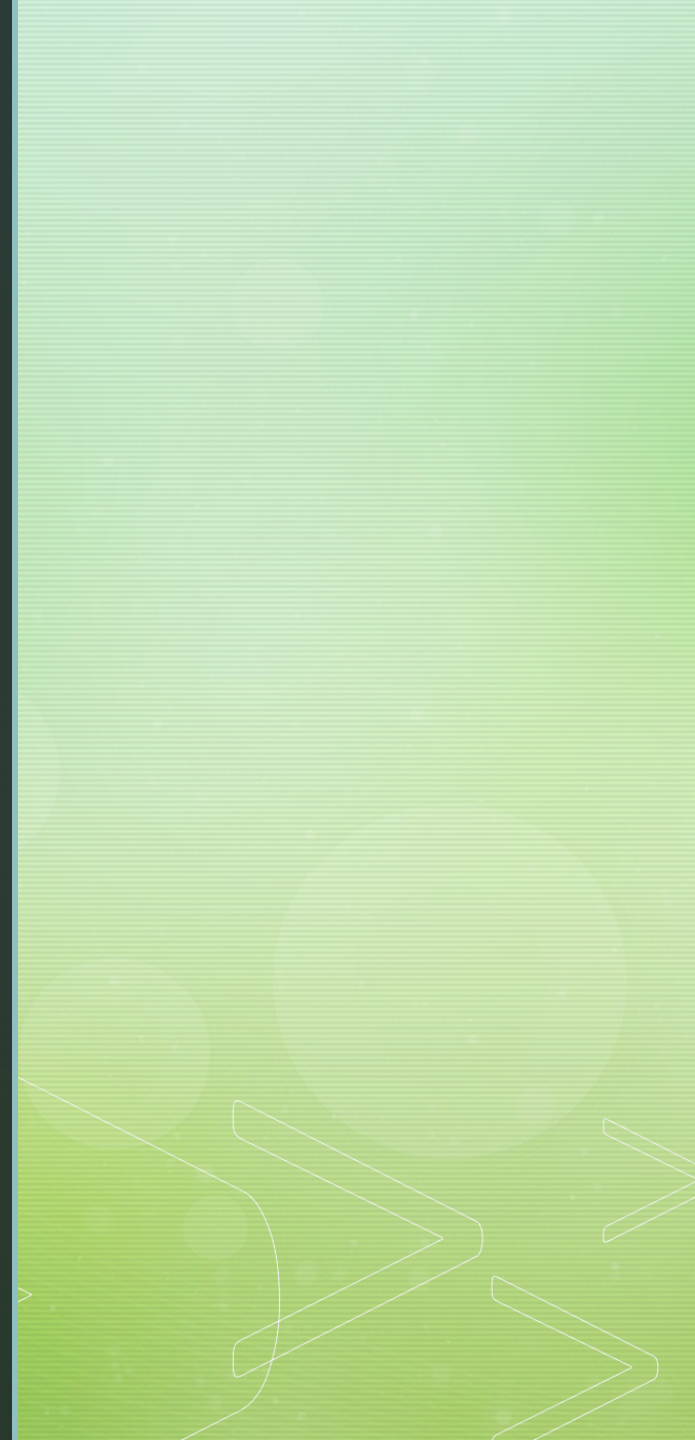

# Oregon Department of Transportation's Role in Traffic Safety

- **ODOT Mission:** To provide a safe, efficient transportation system that supports economic opportunity and livable communities.
- **Oregon Transportation Safety Action Plan (TSAP):** A comprehensive plan outlining goals to reduce fatal and serious injury crashes on Oregon's transportation network.
- **Vision Zero:** Oregon's strategy aimed at eliminating traffic fatalities and serious injuries by improving road safety statewide.

# Local Governments and Safety Action Plans

- **Local Safety Action Plans (LSAP):** These are strategic documents developed by cities, counties, or regions that address specific safety needs based on crash data, community input, and transportation patterns.
