- Oregon Transportation Safety Action Plan (TSAP): A comprehensive plan outlining goals to reduce fatal and serious injury crashes on Oregon's transportation network.
- Vision Zero: Oregon's strategy aimed at eliminating traffic fatalities and serious injuries by improving road safety statewide.
