## **Advanced Professional Series (APS) Description**

FEMA's Advanced Professional Series, certificated by Oregon Department of Emergency Management consists of five required courses and five elective courses. The intent of the **APS** is to provide skills in emergency operations and management needed to perform essential work in a disaster. These skills may be developed through this series of courses that offers "how to" training focused on practical information. This series emphasizes applied skills in disaster operations, management and coordination.

## The **five required training** courses are:

- IS2200: Basic Emergency Operations Center Functions
- G0191: Emergency Operations Center/Incident Command System Interface OR E/L0449: Incident Command System (ICS) Curricula Train-the-Trainer
- G0557: Rapid Needs Assessment
- G0205: Recovery from Disaster Local Community Roles OR E0210: Recovery from Disaster Local Community Roles
- G0393: Mitigation for Emergency Managers OR E/G0318: Local Mitigation Planning Training

<u>Five elective</u> courses are also required to receive an *APS Certificate of Completion*. Courses may be chosen from the following list:

- E/G0288: Local Volunteer and Donations Management
- L0363: Multi-Hazard Emergency Management for Higher Education
- IS0703: National Incident Management System (NIMS) Resource Management
- E/G0202: Debris Management Planning for State, Tribal, Territorial, and Local Officials

- E0930: IEMC/Community-Specific
- G0108: Community Mass Care and Emergency Assistance

- G0271: Hazardous Weather and Flooding Preparedness OR IS0271: Anticipating Hazardous Weather and Community Risk
- G0272: Warning Coordination
- E/L/K0146: Homeland Security Exercise and Evaluation Program (HSEEP) Training Course
- G0235: Emergency Planning
- E/L/G0141: Instructional Presentation and Evaluation Skills
