Administrative Matters

a) Call Meeting to Order/Welcome: Chair

The meeting was called to order at 10:00 am

b) Housekeeping, Roll Call: Board Administrator Partner

- c) Old Business
 - Review and approval of February 20th meeting minutes.

The minutes were approved by the council.

- d) New Business
 - T. OEM update on legislation and the 90-day assessment

Oregon Department of Emergency Management Director, Erin McMahon provided opening comments and discussed the final stages of ODEM's Stockpile Working Group. She discussed the funding for the Crisis Management System. ODEM has been given three Human Resources positions, one manager and two professionals. ODEM will also be bringing on board a CFO, and the 90-Day Strategic Planning has entered a public comment period.

II. Election of a chair and Vice chair

> Mark Spross nominated Jake Shores as Chair; Laurie Chaplin seconded the motion. Jake Shores accepted, and the motion was passed by the council. Mike Harryman nominated Bryan Lee as Vice Chair. Kelly Minty seconded the motion and the motion was approved by the council.

III. Discussion: What qualifications should be required to obtain certification as an **Emergency Manager volunteer in Oregon?**

This topic was tabled for a future meeting.

IV. **EMPG Funding formula updates:**

Kelley Minty provided an update. Recommendation: 120,000 to go to 4 different Oregon

Emergency Management projects—training support, exercise support, learning management system, grant management system. Remainder of the funds would be divided (roughly 8,000 each) to the local entities that said they could accept the funding. Carole Sebens added that the group is tasked with updating the formula for future rounds but also how to divvy up the current money. The group would like this group to review the recommendations. Grant year is 2023. Funds must be spent by 9-30-2025. Laurie Chaplin moved to approve the allocation of funds. Kelley Minty seconded the motion. The council approved the motion.

V. Jake Shores new position GMR.

Jake Shores recently took the position as a National Clinical Manager for the Global Medical Response. The council congratulated him.

VI. Grant Management Software rollout:

The council decided to table this discussion as Deputy Director Winningham was needed in another meeting.

VII. Any recommendations on upcoming agenda items? Would we like to extend invitations for the following?

 Mike Harryman agreed that presentations on mass care, evacuation assembly points (EAPs), and subduction zone island mapping would all be valuable topics.
- iii. Dacia Grayber: HB 4044 A did not pass this legislative period. presentation on toxic inhalation statewide study roadmap going forward Mike Harryman asked if the council could also hear what Policy Option Packages OEM is putting forward?
- VIII. Would the council like to approve a motion to add a member to the council to represent special districts and/or tribes?

Mike Harryman: He worked with Representative Evans on developing the councils and the intent had been to have tribal representation on this and EPAC. He would support the addition of a tribal member and special districts. He motioned to add tribal and special districts representatives to the council. Matt English seconded the motion. The council approved the motion. Jonna will follow up.
