SUMMARY REPORT

009 Samaritan-Norco: One-Year Follow-Up

The Oregon Health Authority's <u>Health Care Market Oversight</u> (HCMO) program reviews proposed heath care business deals, like mergers and acquisitions, to make sure they won't harm people and communities in Oregon. After completing a review, OHA issues a decision about whether a business deal, or transaction, involving a health care company should proceed as planned.

On May 4, 2023, OHA completed a review of the proposed purchase of the assets, both tangible and intangible, used in the business of Samaritan Medical Supplies, LLC ("SMS"), a durable medical equipment provider wholly owned by Samaritan Health Services, Inc. ("Samaritan") to Norco, Inc. ("Norco"), an industrial and medical supply company operating in seven states, including Oregon. OHA approved the transaction, which subsequently closed on May 22, 2023.

For all approved transactions, OHA is required to assess any changes in Oregon one, two, and five years after the transaction closed and to publish its findings.

(For reference purposes, OHA assigned this transaction the alias "Samaritan-Norco" and transaction ID "009.")

About the Transaction

On April 6, 2023, OHA confirmed receipt of a <u>Notice of Material Change Transaction</u> ("notice") from Samaritan Health Services, Inc. ("Entity" or "Samaritan"), an integrated health system that operates hospitals, clinics, health plans, and medical equipment locations in Oregon. The notice described plans to sell the assets used in Samaritan's durable medical equipment (DME) business, SMS, to Norco, an industrial and medical supply company operating in seven states, including Oregon.

The rationale stated by Samaritan in the Notice to sell SMS to Norco was to allow Samaritan to focus on other "core" aspects of their business.¹

With this transaction, Samaritan will be able to focus more on its core mission of community health and wellness by rededicating resources it had allocated to DME elsewhere in the organization.

After the transaction, Samaritan's DME locations were to be integrated into Norco's network of DME locations. Per the Agreement and statements made in the Notice, Norco intended to provide the same equipment and services within SMS's service areas from the same SMS locations following the transaction's close. Norco intended to accept the same insurance plans as SMS currently did, including Medicare and Medicaid.

The notice stated:

Norco intends to hire as many current Samaritan DME employees as possible. There are no intended changes to DME services, staffing, new investments or other initiatives.



Samaritan further stated:

The goal is for DME customers to not even notice the change other than the name on the door.

When asked specifically about how this transaction would impact members of health insurance plans and coordinated care organizations (CCOs), including Samaritan Health Plans (SHP) and InterCommunity Health Network (IHN) CCO, Samaritan stated that after the transaction SHP and IHN CCO would contract with Norco, just like Samaritan currently did.

The Agreement also included a provision that allows Samaritan to re-enter any product line or service if Norco is not providing adequate levels of service.

OHA's Initial Review

In its initial review, OHA found that Norco had no locations and very little market presence in Oregon other than in the current SMS service areas. The review concluded the transaction would not significantly increase consolidation.

OHA's Follow-Up Review

OHA's follow-up reviews aim to assess the impact of the transaction on health care cost growth, cost of care, access to care, quality of care, and health equity for people in Oregon. OHA also checks whether the entities have fulfilled the commitments made in the notice or subsequent HCMO filings.

This one-year follow-up review analyzed the activities of Norco since the close of the transaction on May 22, 2023. OHA requested and received information from Norco regarding their facilities, insurance carrier contracts, staffing, quality of service, and supplies available. (See Appendix A for a full list of information requested).

OHA also sought public comment from community members about their experience with Norco. OHA did not receive any public comments since the close of the transaction.

Activities and Changes Since the Transaction Closed

Facility changes

Approximately six months after the close of the transaction, on December 1, 2023, Norco closed the 845 SW 30th St, Corvallis location ("Corvallis-SW"), one of the four it acquired. No other changes in the square footage of the remaining locations were made since the transaction closed. The effect of the closing of the Corvallis-SW location is described in following sections of this report.

Staffing level changes

As of mid-June 2024, the three remaining locations have the same number of full-time equivalent (FTE), which is a measure of the number of staff, as compared to the FTE in the original four locations approximately three months before transaction close. The number of FTE in each job role, however, has fluctuated.

Staffing at two of the remaining locations have not dramatically changed since the transaction closed. The third location at 815 NW 9th St, Corvallis ("Corvallis-NW") gained two Respiratory Therapist/Clinician FTE that were previously staffed at the now-closed Corvallis-SW location, doubling the number they had at that location before the transaction occurred.

Norco previously employed an Orthotic Fitter at their Corvallis-SW location. This position has not been replaced or relocated to another location after Corvallis-SW closed.

Overall, staffing levels have not significantly diminished despite Norco closing one location.

Product availability

Appendix B lists DME equipment and supplies currently available at the three remaining acquired locations. Most, but not all, supplies are available at all three locations. Specifically, prefabricated orthotics are only available at Corvallis-NW, power operated vehicles (scooters) are not available at Lebanon, and standard power related accessories for wheelchairs are not available at Corvallis-NW.

After the transaction closed, Norco expanded the product offerings at the acquired locations. Several supplies currently being carried by Norco were not carried previously by SMS. These are listed below.

Notably, Norco added orthoses (custom fabricated, off-the-shelf, and prefabricated) to its supply line-up. But as noted earlier, none of the acquired locations have an orthotic fitter on staff.

A smaller number of supplies are no longer carried at these Norco locations. These are listed below.

Numerous providers are present in the service areas supplying transcutaneous electrical nerve stimulators (TENS), diabetic shoes and heat and cold applications. There are no other providers supplying infrared heating pads systems, and only one other provider supplying neuromuscular electrical stimulators and ultraviolet light devices.

Although a few supplies are no longer available at the above locations, on balance, the supply offerings have expanded overall after the acquisition by Norco. Product expansion may be a result of increased demand for personal mobility devices and from a growing geriatric population.³

Customer service quality

OHA requested key performance indicator (KPI) metrics related to supply fulfillment and maintenance requests. Norco responded that such KPIs are not collected as part of the normal course of business. OHA is unable to analyze post-transaction effects with respect to the customer experience in these areas without such metrics.

IHN CCO relationship

As of July 2024, Norco continues to maintain a participating provider agreement with Samaritan Health Plans, of which IHN CCO is an affiliate. The relationship between Norco, SHP, and IHN CCO remains unchanged, which means the nearly 80,000 enrollees with Oregon Health Plan coverage from IHN CCO can continue receiving supplies from Norco.² This is approximately 29% of the population of Benton, Lincoln, and Linn counties.

Insurance carrier changes

Immediately after the transaction closed, Norco added 12 insurance carriers to its service profile, thereby newly serving patients with these health insurance plans. Norco kept contracts in place with nine insurance carriers. However, Norco did not continue contracts with five other insurance carriers: Humana, Moda Medicare Advantage, Providence Medicare Advantage, Regence Medicare Advantage and United HealthCare. The complete list can be found in Appendix C.

Of the 21 insurance carriers contracted with Norco, membership estimates from Benton, Lincoln, and Linn counties were available for 15 carriers. These membership estimates, totaling over 260,000 members, are a conservative estimate of the number of people who can access DME supplies from Norco through their insurance plans.⁴

Supply charges

Norco reported no changes to DME supply charges to insurance carriers after transaction close.

Two- and Five-Year Follow-Up Reviews

A second-year follow-up review beginning in May 2025 will describe any subsequent changes and a fifth-year follow-up review beginning in May 2028 will look at the impact of the transaction on cost of care, access to care, quality of care and health equity in Oregon.
