



Mobile Health Advisory Committee (MHAC) We're Recruiting!

The Mobile Health Advisory Committee (MHAC) advises the Oregon Health Authority on how to address racism as a public health crisis through a mobile health pilot program. This includes supporting the grant application process to fund organizations to operate mobile health units.

Who Should Join?

People who represent Oregon's priority populations and health professionals, or other experts. To learn how HB4052 defines priority populations visit <u>HB 4052 Enrolled</u>. At least 51 percent of voting members must be members of priority populations.

Are MHAC Members paid?

Yes! Eligible committee members can receive \$178 for each day of work.

What Do MHAC Members Do?

- Help set mobile health pilot program goals to reduce health problems caused by racism.
- Share ideas for creating grant opportunities.
- Recruit and select MHAC members.
- Provide input to help develop a statewide mobile health plan.
