Subject: Notice of Adverse Benefit Determination (NOABD) for Non-Emergent

Medical Transportation (NEMT) Services Requirement Update

This communication is regarding the following Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) and CCO contract section: OAR 410-141-3885(2)(a)(C), OAR 410-141-3885(3)(a)(C), and Exhibit I, Section 3, Paragraph a.

The Oregon Health Authority (OHA) is waiving the NOABD requirement to include the name of the member's primary care provider (PCP), primary care dentist (PCD), or behavioral health professional (BH) within the notice for NOABDs related to NEMT Services only.

This change is effective immediately, as of the date of this memo: October 21, 2024. OHA will not issue any findings for this requirement for NOABDs related to NEMT Services created on or after this date.

This change will be reflected in the 2025 OHA Model NOABD notices, the NOABD and Prior Authorization Sample Evaluation Criteria, and the Member Notice Template (MNT) Self-Evaluation Checklist documents. Note these documents were recently posted on the CCO Contract Forms website and will be re-posted on or before October 31, 2024, with this change included.

OHA will also reflect this change in the next iteration of OAR 410-141-3885.
