Statement of support: Coordinated Care Organization Quality Incentive Program

The Oregon Health Policy Board (OHPB) believes the Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) Quality Incentive Program (QIP) should be centered around the goal of eliminating health inequities. To do this, the program must be informed by the voices most impacted, particularly Oregon Health Plan (OHP) members. Financial incentives should promote the work of those who are making bold, measurable progress towards eliminating health inequities and are best positioned to implement effective interventions.

Reducing health inequities requires addressing social drivers of health and collaborating inside and outside of clinical walls and systems. Bold, measurable progress should involve collaboration between CCOs, providers, systems, and communities most impacted. By incentivizing collective action towards tackling root causes of health inequities, OHPB's aim is to create a more comprehensive, sustainable, and person-centered system and improve health outcomes for all Oregonians.
